## More Members of the Ride \& Tie Association, Please!

The number of members of the Association has become dangerously low over the last couple of years and we need your help NOW! In the mid- $90^{\prime}$ 's we had approximately 500 members. As of December, 2000, we had less than 200 members. Our Association is funded solely by membership dues and donations. Without more income from dues and donations, the Association cannot fulfill its responsibility to "assure the longevity of the sport of Ride \& Tie." By the way, the Championship event is a completely separate activity with completely separate financials from the Association.
Why should someone become a member of the Association? First, they will receive this outstanding Newsletter every two months! It is the only source of information in the world on upcoming races, how to prepare yourself and your horse and your crew for ride \& tie events and results of past races. Second, members who are either first year or are Competitor members save $\$ 10$ for each sanctioned race they enter. Third, members are eligible for the annual points and awards and career milage tracking. Finally members can also use the Association community to find teammates, horses and equipment.
Membership dues and donations provide funding for the administration of our Association (ie, Judy!), the printing and postage for the bi-monthly Newsletter, the maintenance and on-line charges for our very popular web site, publicity activities such as the booth at the AERC Convention and magazine ads and membership activities such as funding for the pro-am races throughout the country.
Our goal over the next 3 years is to grow our membership at least $30 \%$ per year. For 2001 we must add approximately 60 more members than last year. You can help by renewing your own membership if you haven't already. If you are a Life member, consider making a donation during this critical time. You can also encourage your friends and family to become members as well for as little as $\$ 20$ per year. Without our Association, our sport may cease to exist. We need your help, please!

# Shine \& Shine Only Ride \& Tie

Onc out of three races isn't bad! The year got off to a wet start with the January and February Shine \& Shine Only (SASO) RAT inaugural year races being canceled due to park closures. I cannot say that I did not start to get a little nervous that when the Wednesday before the March race the weather report started calling for weekend rain. March 24, however, turned out to be a perfect weather racing day. The final tally was six teams competing, four in the 22 -mile sanctioned event and two teams out for a great time in the 10 -mile event. Steve Shaw and Michele Shaw are especially commended for teaming up with novices, Cristina Penilla and Tracy Hofstrand, respectively. The team of Les Nightinghill, Dawn Hartsock and Slick, entered in the 10mile cyent, but walked back from the vet check, so maybe we should give them credit for a sanctioned distance!? At the last minute we lost four teams doe to human and horse illness. This was particularly unfortunate for me because Curt Riffle and I had big bucks bet for reaching 10 teams!...Curt, there's always next year! I will say that while more teams would have been great, and of course necessary, to keep this crazy sport alive, I had my hands full managing my first race with six teams. Thanks to everybody who helped prior to the event and as volmeeers on race day.
Camping and vetting started on Friday night at Maryben Stover's pasture. The place was hopping because the 50 or so teams participating in the 25/50-mile Endurance Rides were also there. Becky Widler's horse Don, definitely let us know that he knew it was the first RAT of the season (in northern California) by showing his excitement with an escape from his trailer tie and making a mad dash across the pasture.


Don, Becky and Laurie Wilson, in typical form let us all know that they have stayed in shape during the winter months by their overall win and the Best Condition award to Don.

The race start on Saturday morning was scheduled for 8:30 a.m. intentionally to ayoid conflice with the Endurance Riders at the 10 mile vet check. I did not hear any complaints from the Endurance Riders or the RATs so $I^{\dagger} d$ say the combined event was quite successful.
The start was not umusually eventful, except that it took Jim Steere and Wesob about five mimutes to cross the start line and when they finally did, Jim made him furn around and do it all over again.
And they were off! The course at Almaden Quicksilver Park was similar to the Quicksilver Pro-Am course (Don't forget to be there on May 5!), except the first loop was eliminated, and a new section, including some single track was added towards the end of the race. The new section called "English Camp", is an historic area of the park that used to house a commanity of Quicksilver miners. Some of the structures and the old cemetery still exist. This section of the park was only re-opened to the public a few years ago. I'm sure all of the RATs took the opportunity to enjoy the local historic landmark.
The best part of the course is that the participants only had to climb "Cardiac" once! So for those of you looking for a good excuse to get out there next January, February and March, there you have it! Do you need another reason?..... I neglected to mention during the pre-race meeting that early spring is the mating season for wild turkeys living in the park. While marking trails, Friday before the race, we saw two males with their phumes fully extended coaxing the females. Thad intended to remind everybody to keep their ears and eyes open for them, but I had a senior moment... Oh well, you can always sce them at next year's SASO race series
All, well nearly all, teams finished with huge grins on their faces, and gave me the nltimate compliment by telling me the course was well marked (I did have help), so overall I'd say the day was a tremendous success. I had almost as much as fun as when I'm racing,...SASO 2002!

## Making a tie rope:

Materials (go to REI; remember to pick up some GU):
8-10 feet of rock climbing webbing - 1 inch wide
2 carabiners - regular size, quick release
1 aluminum O ring
Assembly:
Tie the $O$ ring about 3 feet from one end of the webbing using a square knot.
Tie the carabiners to each end of the webbing with a square knot. Duct tape over the knots and carabiners to keep the webbing from sliding on the carabiners. Give some quick yanks to make sure it is "set". Be sure to remove any price tags, then rub in horse sweat and dirt to "season" it. Time for ride \& tie!

Join us, the Southern California Ride \& Tier's, for an exciting NEW series...... and a BUCKLE series at that! Four (4) Ride and Tie competitions are scheduled in our area.
The first race will be in Ramona, CA, in June. This will be the first R\&T held in Ramona. How wonderful to find a new venue for our sport.
The second in the series will be the $3^{\text {rd }}$ Annual Horse Thief Canyon R\&T, located just off interstate 8 in San Diego's east county, Easy access, a great course with varied terrain, and a great awards banquet have made this race a past favorite among area R \& T's.
The Manzanita $R \& T$ will be the third in the series. Being held on October $6^{\text {th }}$ along with the Manzanita Endurance Ride at the Manzanita campground, complete with corrals, RV hookups, campsites with lots of trees and hot (yes, hot) showers. This is a wonderful, fast course, and the views out there are just one highlight of a super weekend.

For our fourth and final race in the series, we are happy to announce the return of the "Cuyamaca Ride \& Tie"! This final race will be held November $3^{\text {th }}$ in the mountain area of San Diego. As many of you know from the past, this site is equipped with all the amenities. The course winds through the mountains, high pines, and beautiful meadows,
Competitors completing all four of the series Ride \& Ties will be awarded custom belt buckles. This will be done on an individual basis, so you may team up with a different partner (bring in some new R\&T's) for each race. A horse completing all four races will also be eligible for a series halter, A five dollar surcharge will be added to entry fees for this series.
All four races will have their own awards for that particular race as usual with points earned for R\&T association members. You must be an association member to participate in the series. You can join at the first, or any Ride \& Tie event for only $\$ 20$ for the $1^{\text {st }}$ year membership.

## Ride \& Tie Coaching Tip\#1

Runners, remember to drink! Make sure you drink at least one water bottle ( 16 oz ) every hour. Experiment with the various sport drinks BEFORE the race and pick one that works for you. Drink at least one water bottle before the race to make sure you are hydrated, Dehydration can cause muscle cramping and can lead to "bonking". I have found that a mix of $50 \%$ water and $50 \%$ Gatorade works well with Gu and doesn't cause stomach/intestine discomfort. Energy drinks help replenish the electrolytes you lose with sweat Runners going out of the vet check should always carry water! You may not see your horse and partner (and therefore water) again for 30 minutes or longer! Have pre-filled water bottles for your crew to quickly replace the containers carried on the horse. Neoprene bottle carriers for saddle's pommel or cantel seem to work the best. Look for water bottles made by Specialized. Their caps work the best and they don't retain the flavor of the liquid. While a cold beer really tastes good after an event, make sure you drink water and/or an electrolyte.

## Pro-Am Ride \& Ties - New People and Lotsa Fun!

Pro-Am racing is the most fun way to involve new people in our sport. A pro-am team consists of an experienced ride \& tier (completed 3 sanctioned races) and an amateur. Consider it a type of on-the-job training! While our sport seems simple, it can become very complex to someone who is new. Having someone to "lean on" really can help make the sport be even more fun. Pro-Am teams only compete against other pro-am teams in these special pro-am races while pro-pro teams do not receive team points in the Association's annual points competition. This encourages pro competitors to team with amateurs and hopefully find more new people. The Association partially funds awards for the Pro-Am category including a free entry to the next Championship to the winning pro-am team. Pro-Am race managers can help match amateurs with pros and often, as in the case of the Quicksilver Pro-Am, hold practice clinics before the actual race so these new teams can prepare for the event.
