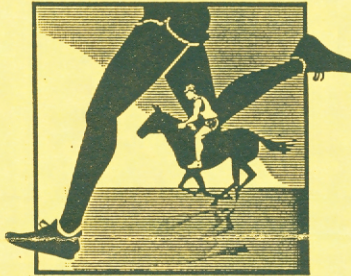

This is in addition to the awards given out by the Race. Donna Jones, the Race Director, is one of our most vibrant ride and tiers and the event is sure to offer a lot of fun and camaraderie for all.



Up in Idaho, near beautiful Sun Valley, the Sun Valley Ride & Tie, a sanctioned event, was held last weekend. We heard they were going to have a good turnout. **The Morgan Territory Ride & Tie, scheduled for October has been canceled.** The Cuyamaca Ride & Tie, on October 31st, is the last sanctioned event of the year and is always well run by Race Director Kathy Appleby. It is a great course, set among the changing fall colors of the trees.

We had a Board meeting at this year's Championship and seated a new Board of Directors for The Ride and Tie Association. We will introduce them to you in our next issue of the *Journal*. We welcome them.

# 1992 NATIONAL POINT STANDINGS

These are the current standings for the National Point System. The National Point Champions are ride and tiers who compete all year long in Association sanctioned ride and ties. The ride and tiers competing for National Champion accumulate points for each sanctioned event they compete in based on their finishing place, number of teams beaten and their mileage.

The results recorded here reflect the points accumulated in 1992 for the following sanctioned ride and ties; **Mountainside, Speed & Steed, Old Stagecoach, Castlerock, Bay Hills, Cuneo Creek, LEA and the World Ride & Tie Championship.** Questions concerning the scoring should be addressed to Rick "Maddog" Appleton at 707-765-0913. There has been some very friendly but spirited competition this year

for those vying to be a National Champion. As the year slowly comes to a close we have three sanctioned events yet to be scored. They are the Sun Valley R&T in Sun Valley, Idaho, the Bloomfield Boogie R&T in Grass Valley, CA and the Cuyamaca R&T near San Diego, CA. The purpose of the point system is to encourage more participation at the smaller rides, and also, as a way to recognize those individuals who ride and tie all year long. They are very important to the sport as they provide the "base" which helps the sport of ride and tie to continue. The National Point System year ends on December 31st. **To be eligible for the National competition you must be a member of the The Ride and Tie Association prior to the World Championship event each year.** Good Luck to all.

# Pro Am Events Scheduled for 1992

## **\*\*Please note changes to Amateur eligibility-Pro Am Rule #1\*\***

In an effort to bring new people into the sport of ride and tie, The Ride & Tie Association provided awards for two Pro Am ride and tie events in 1991. They were a great success and The Ride and Tie Association is once again providing awards for two Pro Am events in 1992. The Ride and Tie Association challenges all veteran ride and tiers to take the time in 1992 to introduce someone to the sport of ride and tie and get them really started in the sport.

This will provide recognition for both members of the team. It will recognize the veteran side of the team for their efforts in getting someone started in the sport. It will also recognize the amateurs who are competing in their first ride and ties.

Two Pro Am competitions were scheduled for this year. A spring Pro Am event, the Speed & Steed Ride & Tie was held May 2, in San Jose. The fall Pro Am competition will be the Bloomfield Boogie on September 19.

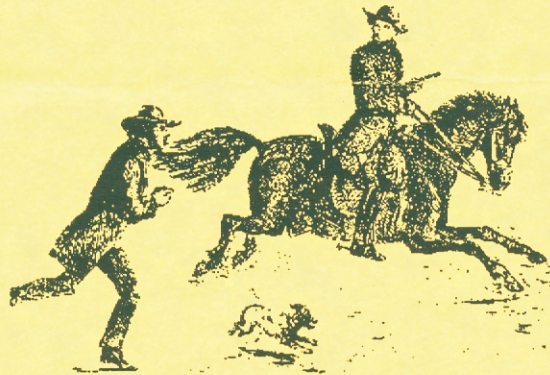
The Pro Am awards are given in addition to any awards that the ride may be giving, thus someone competing in the Pro Am division will still be eligible for the open division awards. The criteria for eligibility for the Pro Am category are:

1. One partner of the team must be amateur. An amateur is defined as someone who has not completed more than two ride and ties over 20 miles in length.

2. At least one member of the team must be a member of the Association at the time of the race.

3. Two amateurs may compete in the Pro Am division, but the above rules will still apply.

4. There will be someone from the Association at each race to enable you to join the Ride & Tie Association if you want to be eligible for Pro Am prizes. You must be a member before the race starts.



The Pro Am category proved to be a success in 1991 as well as lot of fun. Since the Pro Am teams are all competing against other teams who have at least one person who is just learning the nuances of the sport a lot of interesting things can happen during the race.

The response to the Pro Am division has been enthusiastic. Everyone who has taken the time and effort to help someone get started in the sport of ride and tie speaks of the intangible rewards that come from helping someone else get the thrill of ride and tie in their soul!
