National Awards Banquet Set For Saturday, January 30th

The 1992 National Awards Banquet is scheduled for the evening of January 30th at the Sheraton Hotel in Rancho Cordova, CA. We will hold our mid winter Board meeting in the afternoon at the same hotel. This get together is in conjunction with the American Endurance Ride Conference's West Region Convention.

The National Point System Awards Banquet is to recognize those individuals and teams who competed in ride and ties all year long. They are the base core for local races and are competitors who basically just love to ride and tie more than other equestrian sports. Awards and certificates will be awarded to honor the individuals and teams who compiled the most points in 1992. (See year end standings this issue).

We traditionally have a lot of ride and tiers who attend the AERC convention. After the Awards Banquet we can dance to the music of the Sheraton Hotel's band. This will be our third year and it's a lot of fun. We are asking all who come to bring their ride and tie photos and albums from years past to give us all a nostalgic look back.

The West Region AERC Convention will be all day on Saturday. They will have a some seminars and a trade show with vendors of all types, selling and displaying the latest in tack and equestrian products. The Ride and Tie Association will have a booth there as well. If the trade show doesn't interest you, Sacramento has a very interesting part of town called Old Sacramento which has shops and stores catering to the tourist.

ride and tiers and participate in the AERC West Region Convention. Please let us know if you plan on attending by returning the form below to the Association. We need to know as soon as possible so we can turn our order into the caterer. Dinner reservations for the banquet are \$20. This is the actual cost of the dinner and reserved banquet room. Gratuities are included in this cost. I have coordinated with the AERC West Region Convention committee to enable us to use the rooms they have reserved at the reduced rate of \$65. Call the Sheraton for reservations at 916-638-1100. Reservations must be made two weeks in advance. After that, it will be on a first come first served basis. If you are driving take Highway 50 through Sacramento to the Sunrise exit, turn on Folsom, and then to 11211 Pt. East Drive.

1992 NATIONAL POINT CHAMPIONS

These are the current standings for the National Point System. The National Point Champions are ride and tiers who compete all year long in Association sanctioned ride and ties. The ride and tiers competing for National Champion accumulate points for each sanctioned event they compete in based on their finishing place, number of teams beaten and their mileage.

The results recorded here reflect the points accumulated in 1992 for the following sanctioned ride and ties: Mountainside, Speed & Steed, Old Stagecoach, Castlerock, Bay Hills, Cuneo Creek, LEA, the World Ride & Tie Championship, Sun Valley, Bloomfield Boogie and Cuymaca. Questions concerning the scoring should be addressed to Rick "Maddog" Appleton.

There has been some very friendly but spirited competition this year for those vying to be a National Champion. The purpose of the point system is to encourage more participation at the smaller rides, and also, as a way to recognize those individuals who ride and tie all year long. They are very important to the sport as they provide the "base" which helps the sport of ride and tie to continue. The National Point System year ended on December 31st. To be eligible for the National competition you must be a member of The Ride and Tie Association prior to the World Championship event each year. Awards are presented to the top individuals at the mid winter meeting and Awards Banquet.
