Dues-Dues-Dues

It is that time of year again. The sport of ride and tie needs your membership dues to continue to be viable and carry on its work. Dues are paid on the fiscal year of January 1-December 31. As in previous years to be eligible to participate The World Ride & Tie Championship you must be a competitive member of The Association. For sanctioned events other than the Championship if you are not a member you have the option of paying a one day \$10 insurance fee to enable you to compete. This helps cover some of the insurance and operating costs the Association incurs. Novices and ride and tiers who have not been previous members of the Association are still offered a low introductory membership for \$20 or they have the option of paying the one day membership of \$10.

If you are a paid member of the Association this benefits you in several ways. Part of your entry fee will no longer go for sanctioning fees. Additionally this ruling should help ensure that everyone who ride and ties helps support the sport. It will also provide more members and thus enable the Association to do more to promote the sport.

Your address label reflects your status. Dues are \$50 for individuals, and \$75 for families. Century members (\$100) or more receive a special Association T-Shirt. Thanks for your support.



Quicksilver Ride & Tie:May 6 Fall Event:To Be Announced

In an effort to bring new people into the sport of ride and tie, The Ride and Tie Association has been providing awards for two Pro Am ride and tie events a year. They have been a great success and The Ride and Tie Association is once again providing awards for two Pro Am events in 1995. The Ride and Tie Association challenges all veteran ride and

tiers to take the time in 1995 to introduce someone to the sport of ride and tie and get them really started in the sport. The Pro Am provides recognition for both members of the team. It recognizes the veteran side of the team for their efforts in getting someone started in the sport.



Two Pro Am competitions are scheduled for this year. A spring Pro Am event, the Quicksilver Ride & Tie will be May 6 in San Jose. The fall Pro Am competition site has not yet been decided upon.

The Pro Am awards are given in addition to any awards that the ride may be giving, thus someone competing in the Pro Am division will still be eligible for the open division awards.

The criteria for eligibility for the Pro Am category are:

- One partner of the team must be amateur. An amateur is defined as someone who has not completed more than two ride and ties over 20 miles in length.
- At least one member of the team must be a member of the Association at the time of the race.
 - Two amateurs may compete in the Pro Am division, but the above rules will still apply.
 - There will be someone from the Association at each race to enable you to join The Ride and Tie Association if you want to be eligible for Pro Am prizes.

The Pro Am category has proven to be a success and a lot of fun. Since the Pro Am teams are all competing against other teams who have at least one person who is just learning the nuances of the sport a lot of interesting things can happen during the

race.

The response to the Pro Am division has been enthusiastic. Everyone who has taken the time and effort to help someone get started in the sport of ride and tie speaks of the intangible rewards that come from helping someone else get the thrill of ride and tie in their soul!

Make your goal for 1995 to start someone new in the exciting sport of ride and tie! The time to start is now! Help someone else experience the camaraderie and thrill of our sport.
