## LOOKING AHEAD TO THE 1998 EASYBOOT RIDE & TIE CHAMPIONSHIP

### Greetings from Donner Summit.

Things are shaping up nicely for next years championship. We have 5 enthusiastic hosts in Donner Ski Ranch, Sugar Bowl, Boreal, Royal Gorge, and Soda Springs Ski Resort. They are putting as much time and effort into the event as Judy and I are. With the help of their marketing crew, next years race could be an "event" like the old days.

The trail is beautiful. From one spot on loop 2, you can see the Sutter Buttes, the California Coastal Range, Donner Lake, Lake Tahoe and the Nevada Desert. All of this without having to climb thousands of feet. The course will be quite challenging. There will be a lot of abrupt turns, climbs and descents. No real big hills, but a lot of little ones. So if you want to ride fast, you had better be good. The course will be 31 miles (50k) long. This is shorter than usual. But I have made up for it with the degree of difficulty. This is in an effort to entice new comers into the sport and to get some old timers back into it. So if you know of someone who has used the excuse that the race was just too long, be sure to tell them the new length. Do not tell them that base camp is at 6,900' elevation and we will climb to 7,400' in the race. The camp, start, finish and all vet checks are in the same area. One of the new attractions will be that if you want to watch the race outside the vet checks, you will be able to drive easily to several spots and

watch your team ride by and still make it back to the vet check area in plenty of time.

The campsite is in the meadow at the east end of Lake Van Norden. All the sites are in the same area with a central headquarters for easy access to all the Main Events and Meetings. There are plenty of trees, grass and horse water. It is not perfect though. The train tracks run along the north end the meadow. And they seem to run more at night. (Not really but it seems like it.) So the first campers to arrive will be able to camp as far south as they want.

There are small stores, restaurants, gas stations in the town of Soda Springs (2 mile away). There are big stores and restaurants in Truckee (10 miles away). There is plenty of housing in the area. The resorts have lodging ranging all the way from dormitory style rooms to entire deluxe cabins for rent. These are all with in 2-3 miles of camp. I would recommend reserving early because the summer tourist trade is picking up.

The Cool Rats will be heavily involved with the race production. With that many good minds and strong backs, we might just be able to pull this thing off.

### TRYING TO SOLVE RACE DATE CONFLICTS

The good news is our sport is growing and the number of races in 1997 was at an all-time high!

The bad news is that we experienced some growing pains with the scheduling of events which caused some problems for competitors and race directors. I spoke with many of you for suggestions on improving the scheduling process for next year, and I took your ideas to the Board of Directors meeting held on October 19th.

The board voted to enact the following scheduling guidelines for sanctioned Ride & Tie events, beginning in 1998:

1. There must be a minimum of two (2) weeks between sanctioned events. This applies to all races within California. For races outside California, we would request that race directors follow the two (2) week guideline as well, however, we will look at our out-of-state events on an individual basis should any scheduling conflict arise.

Our new Sanctioning Director, Dave Andreotti, will begin contacting race directors shortly to set up the 1998 schedule and will work with them to help avoid conflicts.

2. All sanctioned races for the year must be scheduled and sanctioned by May 31st of the year. EXAMPLE: A race scheduled for October 15, 1998

must be sanctioned by May 31, 1998. This allows races held in the later part of the year to be included in our published schedule in plenty of time for people to make plans to attend the event. It also avoids the last minute "crunch" at the end of the year, when legs (both horse and human), enthusiasm and weather may be running out.

If a race director wishes to put on an event that has not been sanctioned by May 31st, they may do so, but the race results will not count towards the yearly points and mileage standings.

It is our hope that these guidelines will benefit both race directors and competitors by allowing people to plan their schedules and training. Hopefully this will result in maximum participation in each event.

The Board also is reviewing sanctioning issues associated with multi-day and extended distance races. These will be discussed further at the next Board meeting which will be held in conjunction with the Annual Awards Banquet January 31, 1998 at Donner Ski Ranch. 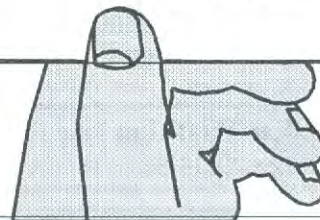
So it is with great pride that we pass the Glorious Velveeta Cup on to the victorious Desert Rats. Don't get too used to it though because we want it back next year. Jon Root

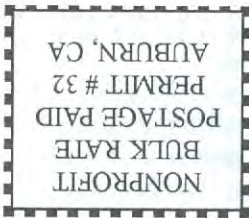
